VIENNA

Vienna: UNESCO World Heritage site. The imperial grandeur of Vienna is a legacy of the powerful Habsburg monarchy that ruled for over six centuries.

- > Schönbrunn Palace: Visit the former imperial summer residence and experience the opulence of the former empire. (Entrance included)
- > Vienna State Opera: One of Vienna's most important opera houses, renowned for its magnificent architecture and high-level performances. Exterior view.
- > Rathaus (City Hall): A neo-Gothic building housing Vienna's city government, famous for its ornate appearance and clock tower. Exterior view.
- > St. Stephen's Cathedral: Vienna's most famous church, with significant religious and historical importance, symbolizing the city.

VIENNA > HALLSTATT > SALZBURG

Hallstatt: UNESCO World Heritage site. Renowned as one of the most beautiful places in the world, this medieval town by the lake and surrounded by mountains offers picturesque scenery and excellent photo opportunities.

SALZBURG > MUNICH

Salzburg: UNESCO World Heritage site. A charming Austrian city known for its baroque architecture, Mozart's birthplace, stunning mountain views, and rich musical heritage.

- > Mirabell Garden: A Baroque-style garden known for its beautiful flowerbeds, sculptures, and fountains, famous from the movie "The Sound of Music."
- > No. 9 Getreidegasse: The birthplace of the great musical genius Mozart, now a museum showcasing his life and work. Exterior view.



Munich: The capital of Bavaria, is a vibrant city known for its rich history, iconic architecture, and lively culture.

- > Marienplatz: The heart of Munich, famous for its historic buildings, including the New Town Hall and the Glockenspiel
- > Frauenkirche: Munich's iconic cathedral with twin towers and stunning interiors.
- > Hofbräuhaus: Munich's most famous beer hall, where you will enjoy a traditional Bavarian dinner.

MUNICH > PRAGUE

Prague: The capital of the Czech Republic, known for its well-preserved historic architecture, charming medieval atmosphere, and picturesque river.

- > Prague Castle: UNESCO World Heritage site. The largest ancient castle in the world. Visit St. Vitus Cathedral, Golden Lane, and more. (Entrance ticket included)
- > Charles Bridge: A 14th-century stone bridge connecting Prague Castle with the Old Town, featuring numerous statues and beautiful views along the way.
- > Old Town Square: A historic landmark in the city center, surrounded by medieval buildings. It's a cultural symbol and hub of activity, rich in history and charm.
- > Astronomical Clock: Built in 1410, the Prague Astronomical Clock features a complex mechanism and an hourly performance, making it one of Prague's most iconic landmarks. Exterior view.



PRAGUE > BERLIN

Berlin: The capital of Germany, known for its history, vibrant culture, and architectural landmarks.

- > Berlin Wall: Visit the remnants of the Berlin Wall, a powerful symbol of the Cold War era.
- > Checkpoint Charlie: The famous border crossing between East and West Berlin during the Cold War.
- > Brandenburg Gate: A photo stop at Berlin's most iconic landmark, symbolizing unity and peace.
- > Museum Island: A UNESCO World Heritage site, home to five world-renowned museums. Exterior view.

BERLIN > WROCLAW

WARSAW > KRAKOW

Krakow. UNESCO World Heritage site. Krakow is a vibrant city in southern Poland, known for its rich history, stunning architecture, lively cultural scene, and charming old town.

- > Wawel Royal Castle: Visit the historic royal residence and symbol of Polish pride. (Entrance included).
- > Main Square: Explore one of the largest medieval town squares in Europe, surrounded by historic buildings, shops, and cafes.
- > St. Mary's Basilica: Admire the Gothic architecture and the famous wooden altarpiece. Exterior view.
- > Krakow Cloth Hall: A Renaissance-era market hall, now home to souvenir shops and galleries.

> Auschwitz Concentration Camp: Visit the site of the former Nazi concentration camp, now a museum and memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. (Entrance included)

- > Bratislava Castle: Located on a hill providing panoramic views of the city, it is an iconic landmark of Bratislava.

- > The Blue Church (Church of St. Elizabeth): A unique Art Nouveau church known for its striking blue exterior and intricate design.
