AVIGNON > LYON > DIJON

Lyon: The third-largest city in France, known as the "Gastronomy Capital." It is also the hometown of The Little Prince and its author.

- > Basilica of Notre Dame of Fourvière: A landmark of Lyon, offering panoramic views of the entire city.
- > Place Bellecour. One of the largest squares in Europe, where you can take photos with The Little Prince statue.
- > Vieux Lyon: A lively district filled with many unique restaurants, snacks, and souvenir shops.

Dijon: The capital of the Burgundy Kingdom during the Middle Ages, famous for its mustard.

> Church of Our Lady: A landmark of Dijon, touch the "owl" sculpture for good luck.



PARIS

Paris: The capital of France, known as the city of romance and fashion.

- > Eiffel Tower. Exterior view. A landmark of Paris and one of the most famous buildings in the world, symbolizing
- > Louvre Museum: Exterior view. One of the world's top four museums, located on the north bank of the Seine in the city center.
- > Arc de Triomphe: The central square of Nice, featuring a fountain topped with a statue of Apollo, the sun god.
- > Champs-Élysées Avenue: One of the world's three major bustling streets.

PARIS > GIVERNY > LOIRE VALLEY

Giverny: Located in the Normandy region of France, famous for Monet's garden.

- > Monet's Garden: Divided into Clos Normand and Water Garden. Stroll through the colorful gardens, visit the famous lily pond and carefully arranged flowerbeds. Monet's famous "Water Lilies" series was created here. *Generally open from April to October.
- > Claude Monet's House: Monet's home, preserving his studio, dining room, and bedroom, showcasing his collection of paintings and personal items.

McArthurGlen Paris-Giverny Shopping Village: Newly opened in 2023, offering year-round discounts up to 60% off.

LOIRE VALLEY > SAINT-ÉMILION > BORDFAUX

Loire Valley. Home to the world's most beautiful castles, with over 300 castles mostly built in the 16th century in the French Renaissance style.

> Chateau de Chambord: One of the most famous castles, a perfect blend of elegance and grandeur, a must-visit in France.









> Visit Wineries and Wine Tasting.

Bordeaux: The wine capital of France.

- > Miroir d'eau: A giant granite slab covered with 2 cm of water, forming a natural mirror reflecting the splendid neoclassical architecture.
- > Port de Caihau: A popular Instagram spot, also featured by Jav Chou

BORDEAUX > TOULOUSE > MONTPELLIER

Toulouse: France's fourth-largest city, known as the "Pink City" for its distinct pink brick architecture.

> Enjoy a leisurely lunch in this rosy city.

Montpellier. The sunniest city in France.

- > Arc de Triomphe de Montpellier. Built in 1691 to celebrate Louis XIV's victory in the Perpignan campaign.
- > Rue du Bras de Fer. A famous street with colorful steps, small shops, and perfect for photos.
- > Place de la Comedie: The central square with a large shopping center and tourist information center.

DAY 6 Breakfast

MONTPELLIER > AIGUES-MORTES > ARLES > MARSEILLE

Aigues-Mortes: A unique natural wonder with its pink salt

> Salins d'Aigues-Mortes: Visit the pink salt lakes and flamingo habitat (open March to mid-November, includes ticket and train ride).

Arles: Known as "Van Gogh's city," Arles inspired over 300 of Van Gogh's paintings. Follow in his footsteps with a Van Gogh-themed city walk.

- > Pont de Trinquetaille: Inspiration for "Bridge and Tringuetaille Bridge.'
- > L'espace Van Gogh: The courtyard depicted in "The Courtyard of the Hospital at Arles."
- > Le Café Van Gogh: (Exterior only, closed) Inspiration for "Café Terrace at Night."
- > Arenes d'Arles: The Roman amphitheater depicted in "The Arena at Arles."
- > Nuit etoile sur le Rhone: Inspiration for "Starry Night Over

Marseille: France's second-largest city and a major port in the

- > Palais Longchamp: A Baroque palace built in the mid-19th century during Napoleon III's reign.
- > Cathedrale La Major. A Roman Catholic cathedral with a unique and grand Byzantine-Romanesque style.
- Basilique Notre-Dame de la Garde: Located on La Garde hill, offering panoramic views of the city and the Mediterranean.
- > Vieux-Port: The historic heart of Marseille, perfect for enjoying the famous bouillabaisse.

MARSEILLE > CANNES > NICE

Cannes: A city brimming with romance and art, famous for hosting the Cannes Film Festival.

- > La Marche Forville: Experience the local lifestyle at this traditional market.
- > Les Murs Peints Marilyn Monroe: A popular mural. The city is adorned with colorful murals.
- > Palais des Festivals et des Congres: The venue of the Cannes Film Festival, perfect for photo opportunities.
- > IGY Vieux Port de Cannes: Stroll along the harbor filled
- > Cannes Walk of Fame: Find the handprints of your favorite celebrities.

Nice: A world-renowned resort city, lies between the serene Mediterranean Sea and the majestic Alps, offering breathtaking views and a serene atmosphere.

- > Colline du Chateau: Overlook the panoramic view of Nice and the entire Bay of Angels from Castle Hill.
- > | LOVE NICE Landmark: Capture memorable photos at this iconic landmark
- > Promenade des Anglais: Stroll along the coastline of the Bay of Angels, enjoying the romantic ambiance of the sweeping bay.
- > Vieux Nice: Wander through the colorful old town, exploring vibrant markets and charming cafes.

NICE > MONACO > AVIGNON

Monaco: The second smallest country in the world, renowned for its yachts, luxury cars, palaces, casinos, and high-end shops.

- > Office du Tourisme de Monaco: Pick up a free map and enjoy a leisurely country walk. Optional activities:
- > Casino de Monte-Carlo: Choose to visit the famous casino (entry fee applies).
- > Le Palais Princier de Monaco: Visit the Prince's Palace for stunning views of the sea and the country (entry fee applies).
- > Jardins Saint-Martin: Enjoy the romantic garden
- > Musee Oceanographique de Monaco: Visit one of the oldest oceanographic museums in the world (entry fee applies).
- > **Shopping:** Indulge in luxury shopping.

Avignon: Known as the "Heart of Provence," Avignon was home to seven popes and boasts a blend of medieval and modern elements.

- > Palais des Papes: A UNESCO World Heritage Site and the largest Gothic palace from the 14th century.
- > Jardin des Doms: A beautiful park offering various viewpoints of the city.
- > Pont d'Avignon Saint-Benezet: A UNESCO World Heritage Site and iconic landmark.
- > Old Town: Featuring well-preserved 14th-century walls, also part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site.
