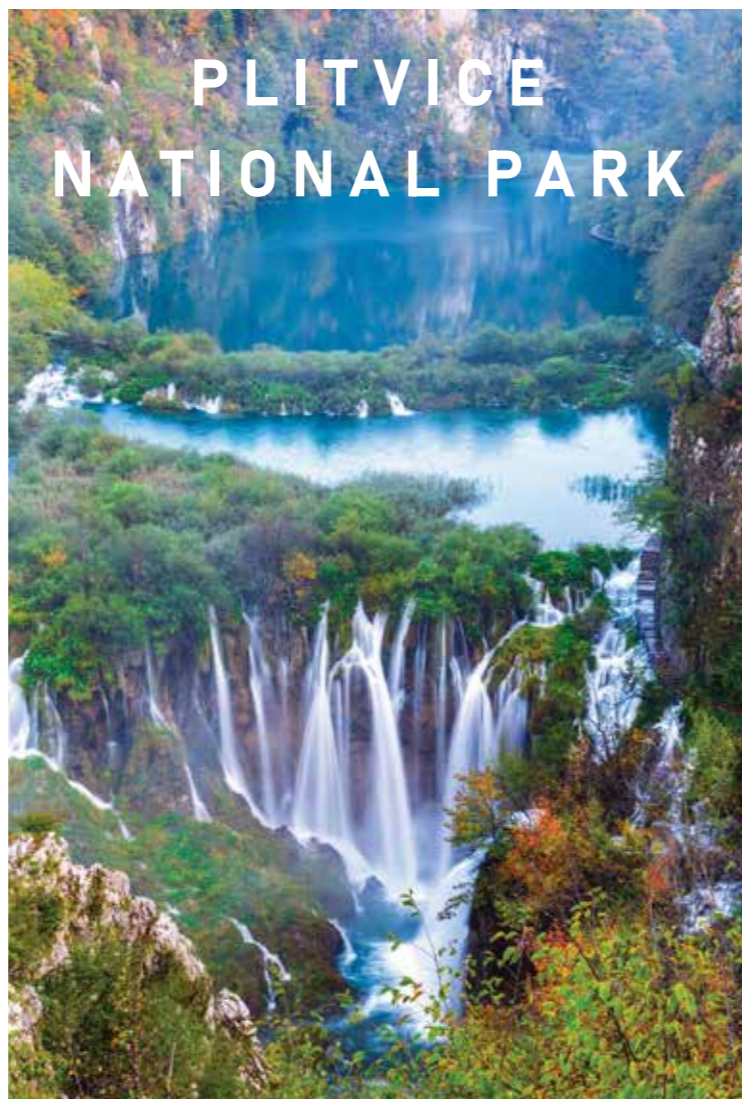
Arrive back in Singapore, ending your delightful holiday. We look forward to seeing you again on your next adventure.

SINGAPORE ZAGREB

Gather at Changi Airport for your long-haul flight to Zagreb, the capital of Croatia.

DAY 2 ZAGREB > LJUBLJANA > LAKE BLEED

Ljubljana: The capital of Slovenia.

- > Old Town: Explore the historic medieval streets with charming architecture.
> Ljubljana Castle: Enjoy panoramic views of the city from this iconic fortress.
> Triple Bridge: A unique trio of bridges connecting different parts of the city.
> Dragon Bridge: Famous for its dragon sculptures, a symbol of Ljubljana.
> Preseren Square: The city's lively central square, surrounded by cultural landmarks.

Lake Bled: A stunning alpine lake in Slovenia.

- > Church of the Assumption: A charming church located on Bled Island. (Exterior view)

DAY 3 Breakfast LAKE BLEED > POSTOJNA CAVE > RIJEKA

Postojna Cave: Located in Slovenia, is one of the largest and most visited karst cave systems in Europe.

- > Experience the unique underground train ride through the cave.

Rijeka: Croatia's third-largest city and its main port.

- > Old Town: Wander through the heart of the city with a blend of historical architecture.
> City Clock Tower: A landmark that marks the entrance to Rijeka's Old Town.
> Trsat Castle: Explore this hilltop castle and enjoy its stunning views of Kvarner Bay.

DAY 4 Breakfast RIJEKA > PLITVICE NATIONAL PARK > ZADAR

Plitvice National Park: A UNESCO World Heritage site, Plitvice is one of Croatia's most famous national parks, featuring a series of breathtaking lakes, waterfalls, and forests.

Zadar: A coastal city in Croatia.

- > Sea Organ: Listen to music produced by the waves of the sea through this unique installation.
> City Walls: Walk along the ancient fortifications that once protected the city.
> The Greeting to the Sun: Watch an interactive solar-powered light show at the waterfront.
> Old Town: Stroll through Zadar's historic heart, filled with Roman ruins and medieval churches.

DAY 5 Breakfast ZADAR > SPLIT

Split: Croatia's second-largest city.

- > Diocletian's Palace: Explore the ancient palace complex, a UNESCO World Heritage site.
> Old Town Hall: Discover this charming Gothic structure.
> St. Domnius Cathedral: One of the oldest Catholic cathedrals still in use, originally built as Diocletian's mausoleum.
> Split Riva: Stroll along the beautiful waterfront promenade lined with cafes and palm trees.

DAY 6 Breakfast SPLIT > HVAR ISLAND > STON

Hvar Island: One of Croatia's most popular islands, is famous for its stunning beaches, vibrant nightlife, and historic town surrounded by lavender fields and vineyards.

- > Take a ferry to Hvar Island, renowned for its stunning beaches and crystal-clear waters.
> Hvar Town: Explore the picturesque town with its 13th-century walls, a hilltop fortress, and a lively marina.

DAY 7 Breakfast STON > DUBROVNIK

Ston: A small town on Croatia's Dalmatian coast, is known for its medieval walls, salt production, and fresh oysters from the nearby bay.

- > Sample fresh oysters straight from the sea during a boat excursion to an authentic oyster farm.

Dubrovnik: Often referred to as the "Pearl of the Adriatic," is a UNESCO World Heritage site.

- > Walls of Dubrovnik: Part of the UNESCO World Heritage listed Old Town of Dubrovnik, renowned for its medieval fortifications.



- > Pile Gate: Enter the old town through this iconic city gate.
> West Harbour: A scenic harbor with stunning views of the walls and sea.
> Jesuit Stairs: Visit the famous steps that lead to the Church of St. Ignatius of Loyola.
> The Rector's Palace: Explore this Gothic-Renaissance palace, once the seat of the Rector of the Republic of Ragusa.
> Sponza Palace: A blend of Gothic and Renaissance styles, housing the city archives.
> Franciscan Monastery: Home to one of the oldest functioning pharmacies in the world.

DAY 8 Breakfast DUBROVNIK > KOTOR > DUBROVNIK

Kotor: Located in Montenegro, a medieval town surrounded by stunning mountains and the bay of Kotor.

- > Old Town: Explore this well-preserved medieval town, a UNESCO World Heritage site, known for its narrow streets and squares.
> Kotor Bay: Enjoy the stunning views of this fjord-like bay surrounded by towering mountains.

DAY 9 Breakfast DUBROVNIK > MOSTAR > SARAJEVO

Mostar: A historic city in Bosnia and Herzegovina, is renowned for its beautiful Ottoman architecture.

- > Old Town: Wander through cobblestone streets lined with traditional shops and cafes.
> Stari Most (Old Bridge): Visit the iconic bridge, a UNESCO World Heritage site symbolizing peace and reconciliation.

Sarajevo: The capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

- > Vjecná vatra (Eternal Flame): A memorial to the victims of World War II
> Sarajevo Meeting of Cultures: Walk along the point where East meets West in Sarajevo.
> Latin bridge: The historic site where the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand took place, sparking World War I.

DAY 10 Breakfast SARAJEVO > ZAGREB

Zagreb: Croatia's capital, a city filled with vibrant markets, historic churches, and lively squares.

- > St. Mark's Church: A symbol of Zagreb with its colorful roof depicting the coats of arms of Croatia.
> Ban Josip Jelačić Square: The vibrant central hub of Zagreb.
> Cathedral of Zagreb: Marvel at the Gothic architecture of this majestic cathedral. (Exterior view)
> Tkalciceva Street: A bustling pedestrian street filled with cafes, shops, and restaurants.
